<p>Create a children’s book about the rock cycle. Make sure the pictures and text are easy enough for a 2nd grader to understand.</p>	<p>Create a poster of the rock cycle. Poster must have details and pictures about each cycle.</p>	<p>Create a play or puppet show about the rock cycle. You must include all information about each stage. Video of play must be 3-5 minutes long and emailed to alison.renstrom@washk12.org.</p>
<p>Create an educational comic strip of “Rocky” the rock and his adventures through the rock cycle. Must include 8 frames.</p>	<p>Write a song or rap about the rock cycle. You must include all information about each stage. Song/ rap must be 2-3 minutes. Video must be emailed to alison.renstrom@washk12.org.</p>	<p>Create a journal with an daily entry for each stage of the rock cycle. Your journal must have a cover and 6 entries. Each entry must be at least 4-6 sentences long. Cover must include an illustration.</p>
<p>Create a travel brochure describing each stage of the rock cycle. Remember, you are trying to “sell” the rock cycle trip to future vacationers.</p>	<p>Create a scrap book of a rock going through the rock cycle. Remember to make it colorful and include descriptions and picture of each stage.</p>	<p>Create a Facebook profile for a rock in the rock cycle. Include status updates, check –ins, posted pictures, and comments from other rocks. Submit name of the Facebook page.</p>
